Please let me know if you are interested.</p> <p>Legislative Recap- H0446 Nabiximols Passed House and Senate (update- signed by Gov. 3/7/22) SB1308 Age to serve alcohol from 19 down to 17. Passed Senate and referred to State Affairs. Susan Jenkins with ILBA- Idaho License Beverage Association, sent thank you email to the Coalition for their education regarding this bill. SB1284 Raising age of tobacco possession to 21- Passed House and Senate, sent to Governor. (update- signed by Gov. 3/22/22) Danielle- My daughter says there are certain gas stations that sell to under 21 and the kids all know which ones. Then the 18 year olds sell to younger kids for profit. HB 688 State directed Opioid Settlement Funding oversight -approved. Target date to end session: March 25, 2022</p> <p>Start discussions to see who is interested in supporting legislation to prohibit advertising and promotion of controlled substances in Idaho. This legislation was introduced in 2021 (S1218) It would address the concerns of many who have reached out regarding Cannabis Dispensaries advertising throughout Idaho, specifically in North Idaho, Nampa and at the Meridian Speedway. The bill was sponsored by Senators Grow, Lodge and Representatives Crane and DeMordaunt. David- Rep. Marco Erickson is a partner of CCI's and a huge proponent of prevention.</p> <p>Leadership Meridian- spoke to 17 attendees and had 4 people request to be added to our email distribution list</p> <p>Life Skills Classes- thanks to David for creating a new partnership with the Meridian Middle School Life Skills teacher, we spoke in the Life Skills classes to 79 students</p>
