Tied the teaching into how we teach our law enforcement officers while talking about how scenario based training can be used as a tool to practice refusal skills. Students respond better to relating it to our officers. Discussed how crime stoppers can be a resource for adults and youth and relates to alleviating possible peer pressure. How parents have to make the decision to call in anonymously on different situations. Had a survey administered at each school to measure teaching objectives. The class is part of the life skills class which is required and part of the WASD curriculum.  April is National Alcohol Awareness and Idaho State Liquor Division (ISLD) will be supplying material to place on social media and maybe posters as part of a new toolkit.  See attached job posting. Please forward any information you feel will be a great resource, to Kendall.</p> <p>Reviewed <i>*7 Strategies for Environmental Change*</i> One example – density limits for Cannabis (CBD/hemp) retailers, looking into changing to have it indicate no locations near schools or parks. Looking into prevention strategies.</p> <p>David- Educating parents on the different ways their children are using substances such as marijuana, tobacco, and alcohol. Showing parents and teachers all the different ways children are concealing substances. Getting into all different parents groups for education opportunities. Teaching parents about social media as well during these opportunities. Possibly using this option to have a workshop for multiple subjects.</p> <p>LT Harper- Brought up the idea of using social media to educate parents in the comfort of the own home. Parents are receiving good information even when they do not attend the events or training. Parents are able to see the interactions of parents who do attend or even the different interactions on social media. Get with other entities and try to bring all the brands together to get people to follow all social media platforms. Looking into Geo fencing for distributing material.</p> <p>SGT. Gonzales- Create short videos to play during high school announcements. Such as social norming PSA's and sharing positive messaging.</p> <p>Dawn- West Ada is putting together a PSA contest related to vaping, and winning PSA shared to different stakeholder. Winner will also get \$500 to purchase items that are being selected by the district. Have had very low parent attendance when it comes to prevention education events.</p> <p>OFCR.
